In one week, the midterm elections will be over, and Congress will turn its attention to a lame duck session. There will be <u>several areas of potential policy efforts</u> that Heritage Action will engage, but front and center will be an end-of-year funding bill for the Department of Homeland Security. <u>It is crucial that a DHS funding bill contain provisions that will reinforce the rule of law along our southern border</u>.

Likely voters in this year's midterm elections <u>strongly support President Trump's efforts</u> to <u>secure our border with Mexico</u> as <u>caravans of immigrants</u> seek to enter the United States. With these events as the backdrop, **it is imperative that Congress work with President Trump to enforce our laws instead of ignoring border security**.

## The DHS funding bill should contain the following:

- Border Wall: fully fund the President's request for the border wall.
- Internal Enforcement: penalize sanctuary cities; end "catch and release"; prosecute employers who hire illegal immigrants; and make being unlawfully present a criminal violation.
- **Legal Immigration Reform**: End family-based chain migration (excluding spouses and children); reallocate the diversity lottery visas and move to a merit-based system.
- Law Enforcement: <u>Increase numbers of Immigration and Customs Enforcement officers</u>, <u>Border Patrol agents</u>, <u>prosecutors</u>, <u>and immigration court judges</u>.

While a compromise has been floated to <u>trade amnesty for DACA recipients in exchange for border wall funding</u>, the price for any compromise should be very high and not be a <u>bad deal for the American taxpayer</u>. It is vital reforms that make our borders secure and provide an orderly immigration process that rewards legal immigrants are included.
